

Yamaguchi University celebrated 200th anniversary of the foundation in 2015 and is the third oldest national university in Japan. technology (MOT). The graduate school has educational

it has been producing a lot of quality graduates by providing
the state of the art but practice-oriented MOT education in
Ube, Fukuoka and Hiroshima, as the only one MOT
professional graduate school in West Japan. International
program, in which all courses are taught fully in English at
Tokiwa campus (Ube), started in 2013.

The manufacturing sector of the US and many western countries has shifted dramatically to developing countries in Asia in the past twenty years. This rapid increase in outsourcing of manufacturing calls for a high standard in management of technology (MOT), integrating technologies with business to create high economic value. As long as there exists an overlapping area of R&D and manufacturing, MOT education will equip you with more highly relevant knowledge, compared to MBA courses.

Structure of the Graduate School's Curriculum

The graduate school curriculum is designed for the major field of innovation and technology management. Its aim is, by taking advantage of technology, to nurture project leaders, managers, or directors who proactively promote new businesses regionally or globally.

The curriculum is systematically organized into three course groups: Fundamental, Advanced and Applied. Fundamental courses cover six underlying areas of technology management. Advanced courses are structured around Strategy Planning, Strategy Development, Business Planning, Problem Solving, Group Management, and Intellectual Property. Special Issue Research – a compulsory course – requires each student to conduct a research on a practical issue.

OFF-CAMPUS RENTAL HOUSING


Real estate agents offer a variety of housing custom-built for students. A staff of International Student Office will go together with you to real estate agents and helps you find an apartment. Average monthly rent is about 25,000 yen but

it varies according to its location and room condition.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE

All international students have to join the National Health Insurance Program. You need to pay the insurance premiums. However, you pay only 30% of the total medical fee when receiving medical treatment. The alumni association "Tokiwa-Kogyokai" also supports a part of the insurance premiums for self-financed international students.

ON-CAMPUS RESIDENTIAL FACILITY

"Ube International House" in Tokiwa campus provides residential accommodation for international students.


